OUR STORY

1995 - RMA Was Founded

By a group of parents interested in starting a high-quality non-profit, Montessori Preschool to feed into the Renaissance Charter School of Douglas County. Both schools started off in trailers working side by side until the Charter School's building was built.

1997- The First School Building Established

RMA and the charter moved to the grounds of Renaissance Charter School (now the home of North Star Academy).

1998 - Land Secured To Build Stand-Alone School

Every RMA family helped with fundraising to secure the down payment needed to become our own school.

2005 - RMA's Stand-Alone School Grand Opening

The Renaissance Montessori Academy opened its doors and celebrated the first year in its own school serving children 2.5 through Kindergarten in Montessori Primary Classrooms.

2017 - RMA Started Exploring Elementary Options

A charter was written, private options were explored, curriculum was discussed and teachers, parents, and community members were surveyed to find the best option for RMA Elementary.

2020 - RMA Opened The First Elementary Classroom

During the Pandemic, it became clear there was a need for a private, licensed, small and individual-based Elementary program. RMA knew what it had to do. We hired our first Elementary Teacher, enrolled our first class of 10 students, and purchased materials to create the RMA Montessori Elementary Program.

The RMA Team worked hard to keep up with the extra protocols while supporting all the needs of the children and keeping the day-to-day as consistent and normal as possible.

Keeping the SNUG RMA Community was a bit more difficult in 2020-2021, but the RMA Team found ways to stay connected and supportive of children, families, and each other. We had small meet and greets, after-school tours of the school, virtual meetings, and outside events.

The joy came by having the community work together and support one another, offering choice for families, being open and in-person for the whole year, and providing as much consistency as possible.




